OUR TRIBUTE JAN IRVINE, 1953 – 2023

It's with heavy hearts and deep sadness that Pride Edinburgh announced the passing of our long-term transgender engagement advisor Jan Irvine at the age of 70 following a long period of ill health.

Jan joined the Pride team in 2005 following her landmark documentary of her life journey in a BBC Documentary broadcast in 2015 and set to work with a passion on transgender engagement at our annual event along with working in the political spectrum to support equality for the

entire transgender community. Drawing from her own experience she sought to make things easier for the next generation doing so while supporting several other projects close to her heart in her local community of Midlothian.

Jan also had a wonderful personality that shone on stage with her stand-up comedy performances alongside sell out "audience with" evenings in venues across Scotland, she never missed a chance to educate through entertainment.

In recent years Jan battled serious illness with the grace, humour and tenacity she was known and respected for. Jan also continued to work with Pride up until our 2023 event advising not only on transgender engagement but to create the "United" theme to support our trans siblings in the current global situation we all find ourselves as far too many battle serious transphobia and bigotry.

Jan always said her life truly began at the age of 48 and she was shown nothing but love and support from both her local community and the LGBTQI+ community and made it her mission to give back to those who helped her most and truly showcased her unique power to educate.

Dear Jan words don't seem enough to convey how much we owe you, however on behalf the Pride Team, The LGBTQI+ community of Edinburgh and beyond, Thank You!, you made the difference by sharing your life journey and affirmed even in the darkest moments there will always burn the light of hope.

A HISTORY OF PRIDE EDINBURGH

2024 marks Pride Edinburgh's 27th event in our 29th year, the gap occurring due to the covid pandemic which lead to the cancellation of our 2020 and 2021 events. The annual celebration of diversity returned to full strength in 2023 and this year sees us building on that success.

To discover the origins of our annual event we have to go back thirty six years ago to 1998 and the first "Lark in the Park" event held in princes street gardens. This was organised by the Scottish Homosexual Rights Group held during the height of section 28, the global Aids Pandemic and a society rife with phobia for the LGBTQIA+ community. The event proved successful and was restaged in 1989 and 1992. In 1991 the precursor to the annual pride march in the city took place on June 22nd with route from Waterloo Place to the Mound Precinct.

In the latter part of 1994 members of the University of Edinburgh's BLOGS LGBT society came together with the wider community to establish Pride Scotland and produce the first annual event which was held on Saturday 17th June1995. Despite the rain over 3000 people joined that historic march and enjoyed a festival held on the Meadows. This would then see Pride Scotland establish itself as Pride Scotla whose annual event would alternate host cities between Edinburgh and Glasgow over the next thirteen years.

2008 saw Pride Scotia become an Edinburgh only event as Pride Glasgow became its own group and both Edinburgh and Glasgow would host annual events on the proviso they would never schedule them together on the same date.

The years 2008 to 2016 saw Pride Scotia move to various locations around the city including, Rainbow triangle scene venues and nightclubs hosting events, with festivals also being held in the Meadows and in Pilrig Park.

In 2016 the original Pride Scotia organising committee handed the reigns over to the next generation, this new team established Capital Pride a registered charity to support the annual march and festival. It was also time to rebrand and embrace the capital city and Pride Edinburgh was established.

Pride Edinburgh established a long term working relationship with Edinburgh University Students Association and the wider University to become our long term host venue a relationship which continues to this day and continues to see Pride taking over more space at the Bistro Square campus each year. 2024 will see the McEwan Hall being used for the first time to host the community fair and associated community events. While Bistro Square itself will once again host the Festival Main Stage arena adored by the traditional Pride carpet.

It's incredible to think that Edinburgh has been front and centre of the march to equality and diversity for nearly forty years and sadly the work and message of Pride goes on, as we continue to tackle the issues that pervade all our lives. The one thing that has never changed and never will change is Pride Edinburgh will always be a community lead event for and by the community and will be forever free of charge at the point of contact.

The pages of history a wait to be written for the 2024 event and beyond, but the annual event will continue to make an impact and bring the LGBTQIA+ community together in the most potent of symbols and prove to the world that we are here, we won't give in to bigotry and we stand together marching towards a better world for ourselves and each other. So let the journey continue........









FOCUS: PLANET BAR & KITCHEN

2023 saw the closure of Habana Bar, a long term favourite on the Edinburgh LGBT+ scene which makes the venue scene in our capital city the most compact it's ever been, so we at Pride thought it was time to shine a light out our cherished venues. Therefore we are launching a new article for the Annual Pride Guide! "Focus:" each year we will look at scene venue, its history, its impact on the community and why the venue is so beloved by us all.

Where better to start that one of Edinburgh's longest running venues, Planet Bar and Kitchen at Baxter's Place which for the last 14 years has seen myself drag queen legend Miss Cilla Slack as its Land Lady and owner whose transformation of Planet is remarkable and leaves an indelible mark on our city.

Speaking to Pride Cilla herself says, "Entertainment runs through the heart of Planet. Planet was a bar very famous as the Mayfair and then more commonly known as "Stage Door". The bar was popular and always thriving as a Family ran Bar with a much loved Matriarch as the Landlady and her family working the bar and Kitchen."

"I believe there was a piano that she loved to play and sing to, the Queen Vic springs to mind. The Family still visit to this day and there is a picture that the former landlady bought from a local artist hanging up in the bar now that her niece brought in for us to display as wee nudge to the bar's history."

"The bar then seemed to fall into the wrong hands and lots of trouble broke out so the Brewery decided to chase after the pink pound and changed the bar to "Route 66" this was in the very early 90's and this soon became a very popular and very well ran bar by Steve and Craig. Eventually they decided to modernise and go more modern as the bar still had all the Stage Door decor and traditional bar feel to it and they decided on the name of Planet Out. This was just after the Millennium and a more modern feel was given to the bar with all different bright colours and animal print furnishings. The new Planet Bar was born when Miss Cilla joined on National Non Homophobic Day which now includes Bi and Tans gender people on May 17th 2010.



After running the bar for 6 years a refurbishment was planed and implemented in 2016 into 17 and this is similar to the bar and kitchen you know and love today."

Quickly becoming a favourite thanks to its vibrant atmosphere, fun staff, low price bar and entertainment which sees the cream of the UK Drag circuit and Club acts take to its stage. Coupled with Quiz night and Game shows plus the obligatory Karaoke night it became the pre club bar of choice. Planet from the start puts community at the centre of its place in the scene and wider community, always supporting Waverley Care, Pride Edinburgh, Hot Scots FC, The Caledonian Thebans and local theatre company Bare Productions.

Alongside these regular charity commitments Planet also supports numerous causes close to its staff and customers hearts. Never scared to embrace change, Planet Out was given a transformation inside and out as it became Planet Bar and Kitchen, placing itself at centre of the scene ready to embrace its future secure in the knowledge it's cherished by all those who visit from across Edinburgh and Far Beyond.

Cilla concludes with "We host our weekly cabaret nights 'Showtime Fridays' with guests from all over the UK and beyond. Cilla also likes to offer spots to up and coming Drag Queens mentoring them and give them the chance to become a gigging artist to either DJ Host or pursue show opportunities. We have just hosted the only Scottish heat of Drag Idol UK and our winner will go and compete down south and if they win they get a gig in every bar participating including many famous cabaret bars in London."

After all, what's better on a Sunday night that friends, drinks and Play Your Cards Right in Planet Bar and Kitchen a venue that Pride Edinburgh is proud to partner with every year!



PRIDE MARCH SATURDAY JUNE 22nd 2024

Starts at the Scottish Parliament, Holyrood, Edinburgh @ 12.30pm

12:15: Pride Marchers to assemble at Scottish Parliament on Parliament Green by Horse Wynd.

12.30: Speeches will commence from invited guest speakers atop a Lothian double decker bus.

13:00: Pride March moves off, heading North and turning left into the Canongate, carrying on up to the High Street. Continuing west up the High Street, turning left at Lawnmarket Junction onto George IV Bridge, at the end of George IV Bridge a slight left into Bristo Place, then left again into Potterrow followed by a right turn into Crichton Street.

Finally a right turn into Charles Street, and The Pride March arrives at the EUSA Campus at 14.00.

All timings following departure are approximate, should the EUSA Campus reach capacity, the remainder of the Pride March will continue ahead from Crichton Street into George Square, turning left into Middle Meadow Walk, dispersing on the Meadows.






